1 Purpose of Report/Recommendations

- 1.1 To update members on progress made by the Education & Skills Delivery Partnership on the application process to become a UNESCO Learning Region.

2 Background

- 2.1 The UNESCO GLOBAL NETWORK OF LEARNING CITIES (GNLC) is an international policy-oriented network providing inspiration, know-how and the sharing of best practice. Learning Cities are a crucial driver in the achievement of the United Nations' 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, which was approved in 2015 and includes 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and a number of related targets to be met by 2030. The Network supports the achievement of all seventeen SDGs, in particular;
- 2.2 "SDG 4: Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all", and;
- 2.3 "SDG 11: 'Make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable.'"
- 2.4 Promoting lifelong learning for the sustainable development of cities is therefore fundamental to achieving all of the SDGs.

- 2.5 The UNESCO GNLC supports and improves the practice of lifelong learning in the world's cities by promoting policy dialogue and peer learning among Member Cities; forging links; fostering partnerships; providing capacity development; and developing instruments to encourage and recognise progress made in building Learning Cities. There are 200 Learning Cities from 40 countries including Cork, Limerick, Bristol and Swansea.
- 2.6 In September '17 representatives from the Education & Skills Outcome Delivery Partnership attended the UNESCO Global Network of Learning Cities Conference in Cork. The event clearly outlined the benefits of becoming a Learning City and the main challenges of establishing a governance structure and a shared vision to take the initiative forward. Following attendance at this conference it was agreed that a workshop should be hosted locally on 26th January, 2018 to enable key stakeholders from the City and District to gain a better understanding of what building a Learning City involves and to explore if this is an accolade to pursue.

3 Key Issues

- 3.1 Further to the workshop held on 26th January to explore the benefits of becoming a Learning City and Region there was unanimous collective support from those present to progress with an application. As a follow up to the workshop a report was issued by the Facilitator (attached as appendix i) outlining a number of immediate actions including the development of a Learning Cities leadership and governance model, the establishment of a working group and the identification of resources to deliver a number of short term tasks. On the recommendations emerging from the report, which were discussed at a meeting of the Education and Skills Delivery Partnership on 26th February, it was agreed that collaboratively Council, NWRC & UU would take the lead on driving this initiative forward. The recruitment of a Learning Cities Co-ordinator was identified as the next stage.
- 3.2 It was also discussed that within the application to UNESCO consideration would be given to a North West Learning Region, something the Learning Cities Co-ordinator will drive forward. This provides a greater opportunity to build upon the recently announced new agreement in education, training and innovation for the North West City region with the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between education sector providers on both sides of the border.

4 Recommendations

- 4.1 It is recommended that the Partnership note the work of the Education & Skills Delivery Partnership and the progress on the application process to become a UNESCO Learning Region.
- 4.2 The Partnership are also advised that a further update on the progress of this Outcome Delivery Partnership be provided at the next Partnership meeting.
